Pastor’s Corner

February 2019

“Some good will come from this, I swear.”

This line comes from the hymn “Weep with Us, Jesus,” written by Jaroslav (Jerry) Vajda after a car whose driver suddenly blacked out plowed into a dozen children on a bench on the third base line on the first day of Little League practice in Riverside, Illinois in 1991. Three children were killed, eight were injured. Jesus told his disciples, **“In this world you will have trouble.”** How do we face tragedy and trouble when it comes our way?

Our interim principal Clet Pfeiffer was hospitalized following an accident on his way to King of Kings two weeks ago. He is home and on the mend, but it will be a long recovery. We remember him and Jan in our prayers. The other man involved in the accident died. (I have spoken to a member of his family and glad to know he was a Christian, but what a grief for that family of this young man who worked at Mayo.) We grieve the loss of our brother, Pastor Dave Maki, who faithfully served The Gathering Place (Trinity Lake Johanna) as well as families at inner-city Trinity First Lutheran School in Minneapolis. To know that he was taken by the freezing waters of Balsam Lake in Wisconsin while he was ice fishing is beyond words to describe, but we remember Deb and their sons in our prayers.

Farther from home, the family of a Lutheran school teacher at Zion, Cologne, lost everything they own but the clothes on their backs when the McCloskey’s lost their home in a fire. And then we look at the states of New York and Illinois and are horrified by their actions of passing into law the Reproductive Health Act, allowing children to be killed even up until birth if the little one has a condition a doctor thinks will cause death soon after being born (New York) and the Governor of Illinois ensuring the taxpayer funding of abortions, saying that it would make his state “the most progressive . . . in terms of women’s reproductive rights.” To which the Church must respond, “Lord, have mercy.”

Jesus said, **“In this world you will have trouble, but take heart, for I have overcome the world.”** The world has been too much with us these days. We live in a sinful world and continue to suffer the consequences as individuals, schools and congregations, communities, and nations. We know this is a fact of life, but it is hard to bear. Only by Jesus are we able to manage, to muddle through the challenges we face in our own lives, in the lives of our families and our neighbors. Even in the face of death, we find our life – even here on earth – in the name of Jesus Christ alone. *(Continued...)*

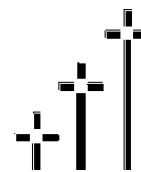

From the Window View of Pastor Lee

In December, we had a total of twenty-two worship services. I may be a new pastor but I'm a quick learner. I've learned that Christmas and Easter are the busiest times of the year for me as a pastor. I can remember coming home after Christmas service, the kids told me, "Dad, you get some rest and we will wake you up when lunch is ready." I said, "No, no, I want to spend time with you all, I'll be okay." I lay down on the couch and three hours later, I was awakened by the smell of food. I must have fallen asleep even though I didn't want to. Three hours had gone by and I didn't even realize it until the smell of food tickled my senses.

After December, I took a week off and went to see family and friends in California. I call it a mission trip because every family and friend I visit is an opportunity to share Jesus. I already know they will ask me, "What have you been up to?" In my mind I'm thinking, "I'm glad you asked." And the story of Jesus begins. For me, it's intentional ministry.

On my way back to MN, I must have caught a virus because it put me down for almost five days. The only reason I made myself get up was that I had a three-day Hmong funeral to conduct. In the eulogy, they said that their father was by no means a saint. I assumed he didn't live his life in a manner pleasing to them. I gave them the message of Jesus and I said, "Even if you didn't think your father was a saint, he now is. Not by how he lived his life but by how Jesus lived and died for your father." Aren't we glad it's not up to us or how people think of us to go to heaven?

We live, we celebrate, we get tired and we sleep. One day, you and I will fall asleep even though we don't want to. Time will have gone by and we won't even realize it. We will only be awakened by the tickling of our sense that something good is near. Some people will open their eyes to see, smell, touch, and hold our Lord and become saints. Some people will open their eyes only to see the eternal torment in being apart from God. I never want anyone to be apart from God, but I know I can't save the world, that's Jesus' job—but I promise to do all that I can until I sleep.

Don't go tell, just tell as you go..

Message From Parish Director Aaron Gjelhaug:

Now that the recent roof project is complete....what's next?

In late 2018 we communicated that our roof loan had been completely paid off. Yay!! This was a big accomplishment, and we were blessed by the generosity that the congregation displayed throughout the multi-year fundraising efforts for the roof project. In fact, approximately \$28,000 that was allocated to the project remains unused after paying off the loan.

As we continue to carry out our obligation to maintain the facility, we now intend to focus on upgrading the parking lot due to its poor condition, which is especially evident in the north lot. So in order to get on a contractor's scheduled for the 2019 "season", we have already begun to engage the services of an engineering firm to assist with this process. Having an expert partner on board will ensure that the underlying issues (i.e., poor drainage, standing water, etc.) contributing to the current lot conditions (i.e., pot holes, crumbling surface, etc.) are addressed, along with any existing safety concerns.

While we won't have a cost estimate until the engineering plans are complete and the final scope is determined, we are expecting the cost to upgrade the parking lot to be significant, and are anticipating the need to secure immediate funding from multiple sources to cover the cost. One source will likely be a new loan from LCEF, which is currently offering a special promotional program at very competitive rates. Another source will be monies donated via congregational fundraising, where approximately \$21,000 has already been donated towards the parking lot project. In addition, we would like to further "jump start" our fundraising efforts by directing the \$28,000 of unused roof funds noted above towards this project.
