PARKING LOT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The parking lot project will begin as scheduled on Monday, July

1st. They will start by milling out and hauling away most of the old pavement. Removal of the curbs and sidewalks will follow. However, the sidewalk from the shed to the north entrance will remain in place through Sunday, July 7th. You will be able to park on Lovell or in the CA lot and walk to the north entrance during most of the project. On-site parking will be limited to the south lot. 
