Pastor's Corner June 2019

At the beginning of my ministry, a veteran pastor told me, "When you start getting calls, look at the amount they give to missions. That will tell you where the congregation's heart is." I firmly believe that God blesses generous people and generous congregations in any number of ways. Later this month, we will each be asked to consider a special offering to "pave the way" as we continue God's work here at King of Kings Lutheran Church and School. Renovating a parking lot may not be as exciting as new construction, but it must be done. As you prayerfully consider your regular and special giving, think about these things:

The more we give, the more we receive. A widow once brought a large memorial gift to the Scholarship Fund of a congregation I was serving. With a condition: "Spend it!" she said. "Don't let it sit there!" Once we started spending the money in that fund, it multiplied. God gives to those who know how to use it to his glory and for the good of his people.

Faithful giving helps us take the focus off ourselves. Just as many of the members of our congregation tithe or give a percentage of their income, so does our church family. Through the work of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, our offerings support new mission starts, campus ministry, ethnic ministries and overseas missionaries. We also support the MN South District in Burnsville. Our District staff is a constant help to us. When I write out the offering check for my family, I don't think about the things we could have spent it on. Instead, I thank God that He continues to give us more than we need.

Giving makes things happen. As you walk through our building, you can see some of the "footprints" of where our sanctuary and classrooms used to be. It's fun to hear people talk about the early years or where they went to school or the old church office. How did we ever manage? But we did, and we keep moving forward by God's blessing!

Enrollment for next year is right on schedule. Our teachers did a great job with our two interim principals this year and we are all looking forward to Mr. Jay Schutte coming on board as our principal on July 1. We are blessed by the ongoing Hmong ministry here at King of Kings. Thanks to your support, we are able to maintain an excellent Christian school and outreach into our community. God has given us tremendous opportunities to share the love of Jesus Christ.

Faithful giving encourages others. While we don't know what others give, we do know that our offerings pooled together accomplish the kingdom work to be done here at King of Kings. Confirmation students drop their jaws when they find out the weekly offering is here. (They would drop their jaws again if they saw what the heating bill is in January and February!) A large number of faithful givers have already been giving to the parking lot project — and it hasn't even been asked for yet! (Not officially, anyway!) That encourages me and I hope it encourages you! It shows us that our members our willing to do their part to sustain the ministry of our church and school. We are also able to help with tuition for families who would not be able to afford a Christian education completely on their own. We are also able to occasionally help our families who need assistance when they go through a difficult time. You and I have no idea of all the ways God blesses what we put into the collection plate.

Faithful giving reminds us that God will provide. Even though the members of our congregation are generous in their gifts to God here at King of Kings, we do sometimes experience the "summer slump." As people travel and spend time away in the summer, we see a decrease in our offerings even though our ministry expenses are constant. God doesn't go on vacation even if we do! Not one of us expects our summer visitors to support the work that is done here in July and August. (If you will be gone most of the summer, consider giving your offering at the beginning of the summer or mailing it in, as do many of our members who travel south in the winter. You may also consider the "Joyful Response" option, which allows consistent giving directly from a bank account. Check with the church office for more information or an application form.)

God has blessed us with so many good things here at King of Kings and I am thankful for your ongoing support of all of them!

we will become deaf to the sound of God, His Word. But thanks be to God that there are Christians that care. Even if you can't hear, you can see and feel the love of God being put on you. They will let you follow them in their group. They will care for you until you can hear again; but this time you will hear the sound of God and not the sound of the world. You used to be deaf to the sound of God until He came seeking for you through His Christian servants. We are followers and leaders at the same time. Followers of Christ and leaders of those who need to hear.


