Pastor's Corner March 2019

"Truly, this is the Son of God."

Last year we received a request to do a Lenten series which focused on the people Jesus encountered on his way to the cross. More importantly, those people encountered Jesus. This season, we will consider some of the historical characters who appear in the Passion. Not surprisingly, some of them were hostile to Jesus while others were friendly. All of these encounters point to one thing: Jesus of Nazareth was not just a man (or a superman); Jesus is no one else but the Son of God.

As we see and hear the testimony of their lives throughout the weeks of Lent, they will lead us back to the cross and the Jesus who was crucified there. The cross and the empty tomb spoke to them and continue to speak to us. Matthew and the other evangelists give us the evidence of lives that were touched by Jesus, the Word made flesh. (Matthew will be the focus of our Lenten Bible challenge as we read through his Gospel together this season.)

As we see and hear and read the evidence for ourselves, I pray that each of us is made stronger in our conviction of what Christ has done for us. Like the Centurion, may we boldly proclaim of Jesus, "Truly, this is the Son of God!"



"We enjoyed reading Luke and knew we were taking part as a member group from King of Kings...also we were able to appreciate the entire story of His life which included so many of his words/conversations. The provided sheets of questions kept us on track."



"Even though I missed a day here or there, this helped me get back into a daily Bible reading schedule. I thought it was unusual, and then I appreciated, the tension between the story of Christ's Passion and the time I was mentally preparing for the celebration of Christmas this year. Of course we know this is why Jesus came, but the Luke reading challenge really helped put it all together. "

"I did do the Luke readings. Certainly any Bible reading challenge is a benefit to the heart and soul and the community of believers!"

"As invited, here is my reflection on the reading of Luke through Advent: FABULOUS.

The exercise was a challenge from the start, as I anticipated, because working through the life of Jesus as we got closer and closer to Christmas, was a brain shift. Yet, it brought the whole meaning to light, reading about the trial and crucifixion just a couple days before Christmas.

I started reading with a review mentality, until I quickly realized: I thought I knew Luke backwards and forwards, but that in reality only meant Luke 1 - 3, not the whole book! I discovered nuances in this Gospel through taking a close look each day.

And then, the icing on the cake came in the Christmas Eve sermon when the beginning and end of the book were tied together with the strips of cloth. Huge! It was like another present wrapped up in the Gospel and opened on Christmas Eve. I will never forget that revelation whenever I hear "the swaddling cloths" read in the future.

So this challenge, along with the sessions of open prayer in the sanctuary, and the prayer walks in the neighborhood, are all great encouragements in the direction this body is going. New life in Christ is invigorated through those three: reading the Word, prayer, and spreading the Word. I appreciate that we as a church are not investing in what I call the "song and dance" routine to attract people, but rather, sticking with the fundamentals to attract and KEEP disciples.
