After a while reality sets in. When we actually go out and pick up the fast food sandwich, it is not what we had in mind. When we test out that product, it doesn't quite do the job it promised. Even that gadget might work for a little while, but then it wears out or becomes obsolete sooner than we anticipated.

In this season of gifts being purchased, exchanged, or returned, we may find ourselves being skeptical of the things we have, the people we interact with, or even the news that we see. We might even find ourselves asking, "is what I am seeing the 'real deal'? Am I setting myself up for disappointment yet again?"
